#### Around the Classes...

Robin Class - Reception: Our Book Week has been fantastic- we've discussed our favourite books, explored various small world trays to retell well known stories and acted out in our role play! There has been some very delicious Gruffalo crumbles and cups of tea with the 'Tiger Who Came to Tea'. We've also been delving deeper into finding lots of facts about animals in our non-fiction texts! Our story of the week is 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear What Can You See?'. We have been ordering the sequence of the story. In Maths we've been looking at measurement - the children have been measuring height, length and distances using non-standard measurements (blocks, feet and hands!). We particularly enjoyed measuring each other to see who was the tallest! We ended the week noticing something has happened to our egg in the outdoor classroom tree... a crack has appeared... Robin Class - Year 1: What a great feeling there has been around school this week with our Book Week themed activities, the Robins have thoroughly enjoyed participating in lots of different activities. We kicked of the week with an exciting launch in assembly and the Book Bake – just WOW! Those exciting creations were incredible! We were we were given a brand-new basket of 'curriculum spine' books, these have been great to start exploring. A huge thank you to all the grownups who managed to share some reading time with us on Tuesday, and if you didn't, do know you were missed, but we did join up with other grownups and teachers. We've had teacher swop, Mrs Webster came and read a book about a dragon... it had a very funny ending! Happy weekend! Kingfisher Class: What a busy week in Kingfisher Class. After finishing our statistics learning, we have moved onto learning about shape – the children amazed me with their vocabulary. In History we have begun to travel back in time to 1914 and consider why animals were useful during World War 1. In English, we have completed our letters to the Big Bad Wolf – again, the children used great quality vocabulary. We have really enjoyed the Book Week celebrations and thank our Reading Ambassadors for a great carousel this morning. Partridge Class: Another fantastic week for Partridge Class! We have been learning all about fractions in maths, using concrete resources to find equivalent fractions. In English we have written some amazing diary entries, based on a story all about life as a refugee. We thought carefully about how the character would be thinking and feeling at each point in the journey. In History we have continued our learning about the Stone Age, looking at how life has changed over time from the very early Stone Age, to the start of farming. Woodpecker Class: This week, we have been celebrating our annual 'World Book Week' and the children have thoroughly enjoyed the range of activities planned. The creations for our 'Bake Off' competition were absolutely amazing and it was great to welcome so many adults into school on Monday to work with the children. In the classroom, we have been working on letters of complaint this week which will feed into the children writing their own next week, so I apologise in advance if they start to complain at home! In maths, we have

been converting fractions, decimals and percentages and the children continue to take it all in their stride. Another great week!
