A.	Pupils wellbeing is unaffected by the school closures and future closures which may occur during the academic year 2020-2021.	 Pupil questionnaires identify growth in resilience over the course of the year. Forest Schools Book demonstrates development of growth mindset and wellbeing. 'Wellbeing Warriors' continue to have a positive impact on wellbeing within the school. Wellbeing events take place annually and are well received by pupils, resulting in an increase in wellbeing.
В.	Pupils identified as having been negatively impacted by the Covid-19 closures have the opportunity to receive proven intervention in order to catch-up.	 Data analysis from TT Rockstars shows an increased percentage of pupils are making rapid progress in spelling. Spelling ages across the school increase by 1.5 months in 1 year. Pupils are confident in using concrete resources and this is evidenced through sustained progress in mathematics. Pupils, particularly those in UKS2, read books where the phonics and comprehension matches. Targeted pupils make at least 6 sub-levels progress on Target Tracker in reading and maths.
