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Around the Classes...

Robin Class: Christmas has already hit the Robin Class with nativity rehearsals in full swing! We have discovered a little more about Guy Fawkes and his plan by being history detectives looking at photo clues. Reception children have been using their phonics to label everything that they draw and Year 1 have been writing poems using adjectives, nouns and verbs.

Kingfisher Class: Kingfisher Class have really focussed on remembrance this week – using the poppy as a stimulus for our writing lessons in English. After finding out more about the significant event in British history, we began to think about using poetic techniques and exciting vocabulary to create our own poppy poems. In maths, we have continued to sharpen our addition and subtraction skills. I know that everyone thoroughly enjoyed their P.E lessons this week – continuing to focus on Multiskills with Mr. Layfield and invasion games through Ultimate Frisbee on a Thursday! Partridge Class: This week in Partridge class, we have finished our topic of poetry and our final poems were fantastic! In maths, we are continuing with addition and subtraction, ending the week by subtracting two, 3-digit numbers! Following on from our work on the digestive system last week, we have been learning all about teeth in science. We are in the process of conducting an experiment to discover what effect different liquids have on our teeth- we are very excited to find out the results!

Woodpecker Class: This week, the Woodpeckers have been putting themselves in the shoes of Guy Fawkes and writing a diary to document his thoughts and feelings during the key events leading up to the gunpowder plot (I did stress we were only pretending to be Guy Fawkes!). In Maths, we have continued to develop our division skills, progressing onto using decimal remainders to increase the accuracy of our work. Our computing work has led us to watching some popular Youtubers (the children knew far more than I did) and we could not believe how much money there is to be made from drawing unicorns whilst blindfolded!
