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Around the Classes...

Robin Class: Robin Class have been busy investigating Guy Fawkes a little deeper. Did you know King James I received a mystery letter warning him of the plot? We have used quills and ink to write our own letter warning the king. We have been checking our knowledge in history, science and geography by taking turns to be 'expert speakers.' We have some excellent experts!

In English we have started reading the text 'Krindlekrax' and used some great writing by famous authors to create our own character descriptions. We are working on persuasive writing in English, and we had a fantastic debate for and against deforestation, using persuasive language to produce a strong argument. In maths we are continuing with addition and subtraction. We are coming towards the end of our work on subtracting and have been using our problem-solving skills to solve challenges. We also found out the results of our egg-experiment. We were shocked to discover that orange juice was the worst culprit for causing tooth decay! Woodpecker Class: We began the week with odd socks to help raise awareness for anti-bullying week. Throughout the week, the Woodpeckers have based our reading and writing on anti-bullying and I have been so impressed with their thoughtful and mature contributions. We have also made massive progress with our long division skills and in P.E. we

enjoyed a game of 'frisbee rounders'. Another great week, keep it up Woodpeckers!
