Around the Classes...

Robin Class: What an amazing Art Week Robins have had. There has been paint everywhere, and I mean everywhere! For that, I can only apologise, but the children have had the best week learning all about colour, using a wide range of mediums to create shades by mixing black or white with different colours. Looking at the artist Kandinsky, they have used his work to inspire their creations. If you ask your child about Kandinsky they may tell you a fact or two. Well done to our budding artists! **Kingfisher Class:** As well as writing our own poetry in English, and investigating division in Maths we have all had a super Art Week! We began by learning some facts about Pablo Picasso and his life; before looking at his portraits of Dora Marr. We were amazed to find out that she was a real person! Inspired by Picasso's use of colour, we began to create our own pieces of work – thinking carefully about how to mix primary colours to create secondary colours and exploring adding white to change the tone of a colour. What a great half term's work!

Partridge Class: Patridge Class have loved getting messy during art week this week! We started off the week with a visit from artist Chris Layfield and then found out more about our artist for the week - Lucy Pittaway. We then explored tinting colours and created some very colourful splash art masterpieces! We used all of the skills we have learned so far to mix colours and choose appropriate painting tools to create our own Lucy Pittaway inspired artwork. Alongside our artwork, we have been working on writing our 'twisted tales' in English and have started exploring fractions in maths. After such a busy week, we are all ready for a well-deserved break! Have a lovely half term.

Woodpecker Class: With half-term approaching, the Woodpeckers have enjoyed art week where once again they have blown me away with their art skills! On Monday, they experimented with mixing colours during their workshop with artist Chris, on Tuesday we learnt more about artist Ben Mosley before replicating some of his work and finally on Friday we have explored how colour can be used to represent mood and emotions. I hope everyone has an enjoyable half-term after working so hard since term began in January and return refreshed and healthy!
