Around the Classes...

Robin Class: It has been a very exciting week for Mrs Dozey and I as we have had the privilege of visiting our new starters in September in their various settings. The children have been eager to find out all about them. It won't be long until they meet them in person during their transition visits. In History we are learning about the history of farming, so we went for a walk around the village and found the Penfold. What a beautiful area! Kingfisher Class: What a great week we have had! In English we have been researching and planning our report texts about the Giant Panda. Partridge Class: In our Maths this week we have been learning all about statistics. We have had great fun using sweets to create pictograms, interpreting bar charts and drawing line graphs. Woodpecker Class: This week has seen us kick off our rehearsals for our end of year show and the children have already impressed us hugely with both their talent and hard work to learn their lines.
