Around the Classes...

Robin Class: Spring is here and the sun is shining. We have had a great time learning outside this week, reading stories, exploring our new water tray and there is lot of writing going on in the provision which is marvellous. We have many children on the balloons this week for their exploration skills, writing, reading and being good role models. We now have tadpoles in the classroom. The children have been asking some amazing questions about them; what do they eat, what will happen next, where will they go? We have been looking at the signs of spring and three mystery buckets have appeared in the setting. We have made predictions about what will grow in them. Our cress heads have sprouted but there are no signs of our sunflowers yet. In Forest School we went to the Nectar Cafe and drew the signs of spring we could see. What signs of spring can you see this weekend?

Kingfisher Class: Our week started off with a wonderful walk in the spring sunshine to look for signs of spring – we found lots of interesting things in Hunton and have used our walk to help us plan a recount in English. In Maths we have been focussing on the properties of 2D shapes and using words like 'vertices' and 'sides', as well as beginning to explore symmetry. Next week we will be looking at 3D shapes and sorting using what we have found out! In R.E we had an exciting session involving a pass the parcel and an Easter story. Kingfisher Class have worked very hard all week!

Partridge Class: I would like to start this week by saying a huge well done to our Year 4 children who, alongside Woodpecker Class, competed in a multi school athletics competition this week. I was very impressed with the children's determination, aspiring to do the best they could and being incredibly caring by cheering on their teammates. As well as this, Year 3 had a mini athletics competition in school, during which they impressed Mrs Webster with their throwing, running and jumping skills. All of this alongside our English work on persuasive writing, and maths work on fractions has made for another busy week in Partridge class.

Woodpecker Class: On Wednesday, the Woodpeckers went to Richmond School to participate in the Sportshall Athletics competition. Not only were the children great ambassadors for our school, but they definitely lived up to our 'aspire' and 'excel' ethos, all trying their very hardest and producing some great performances; many children were even victorious in their events! In school, the children have impressed me enormously when calculating missing angles and in English they have continued to enjoy writing with suspense - I don't know whether to be concerned or impressed by some of their writing! Another great week which has seen the children work hard both inside and outside of the classroom, well done to all.
