Robin Class: As you read this, we will have been to the beach! We are anticipating an amazing and memorable experience. We are excited to see the children's reaction to their beach visit and looking forward to taking our experience back to the classroom to enhance our future learning. Also, this week the children have been investigating plants and have been labelling the different parts of a plant. They have been finding out about similes and verbs ready to put into riddles next week and in Maths they have been learning two-digit numbers in Reception and arrays in Year 1. Our reading sessions are going well, and the children are building in confidence with their decoding, prosody, and comprehension skills.
