Around the Classes...

Robin Class: What a busy start to the week. 'Friendship Week' began with wearing our odd socks at an opening assembly. This was followed by two police officers visiting us from Catterick Garrison. We talked lots about the Highway Code, so we now know even more about road safety. In maths this week, the Reception children have been continuing with 1, 2, 3 and exploring positional language. And the Year 1 children have been deepening their subtraction knowledge. To end the week, we have engaged in lots of activities and discussions based around Children in Need.

Kingfisher Class:

Partridge Class: This week, we had a fantastic history lesson learning all about Tutankhamen. We got into character as archaeologists as we entered the tombs to discover what was inside! Our science lesson this week took us back to prehistoric times, looking at a variety of fossils and discovering how they were formed. In maths, we are now at the end of work on addition and subtraction. We have solved lots of problems and we are now ready to move onto our new unit of work, multiplication and division. In English, we are writing fantasy stories based on the short clip 'Dream Giver'. We have used our creativity to write some fantastic sentences, which we will be able to put into our final story writing next week!

Woodpecker Class: We have celebrated 'Friendship Week' this week, which has involved discussions around how to be a good friend and how to make sure we are always being kind to our friends. In maths, we have been working on division, converting remainders into decimals and exploring written methods for long division - some really tricky skills which they have really worked hard to improve! In English, we started to explore different purposes for writing a letter and particularly when to use formal and informal language - this will help them as we prepare to write our own letters next week. In History, we have continued to learn more about the story of the Trojan Horse - considering evidence which supports it as a factual story as opposed to a myth and the children had great fun in science as they tested to see which materials would dissolve in water! As always, we have been proud of how they always care-aspire-excel in school.
