Around the Classes...

Robin Class: What a week! All of Robin Class have worked extremely hard this week, getting to know their routines, and trying extra hard in their phonics and reading lessons. It's been lovely to read their home comments in the diaries. In maths we have started looking closely at place value. The children have loved using concrete resources to 'Teach, Twist and Deepen' their learning, we have been so impressed! Lots of stories have been read this week and the children have spent a lot of time in the cosy book corner too. To end the week, we have been exploring lots of different materials in Science.

Kingfisher Class: It has been fantastic to get into the routines of our learning this week, beginning our English and Maths lessons. In Maths we are consolidating our place value skills and in English we have enjoyed sharpening our sentence skills through the book 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. We had a brilliant time in Bedale on Wednesday, finding out why people visit the town and what the human and physical features are.

Partridge Class: We have loved starting our new topics this week! In maths we are focusing on place value and have been using lots of concrete resources to help us. In English we are focusing on character descriptions, where we will be writing all about witches as per the description in our class text 'The Witches'- which we are really enjoying reading! Some of the children even questioned if Miss Pole was in fact a witch- after checking fingernails, eyes and hair for clues, we came to the conclusion that this was in fact... not true, but we are loving our story time every day!

Woodpecker Class: This week has seen us get back into more of a 'normal' routine and the children are already producing some excellent work. We have focussed on place value in maths and the children have been incredibly driven, trying to challenge themselves as much as possible. In English, we have been looking at setting descriptions and the children have amazed me with some of their descriptive phrases and use of various skills we have been practicing. I have been so impressed with their work across the curriculum this week and I am sure it will continue – well done Woodpeckers!
