#### Around the Classes...

**Robin Class - Reception:** We have been finding out lots of interesting facts about Space in our 'Space' non fiction text this week - ask your children what facts can they remember? We have also been getting creative in our whole school Art week - exploring painting, printing and the artist Louis Wain. In PSHE this half term we have been thinking about feelings and emotions and valuing differences, which fits in perfectly with our 'No Outsiders'. The children really enjoy this aspect of the week with Harold our PSHE giraffe (it really is a highlight of the week). In music we have been keeping to the beat and performing the same song each week 'In the Groove' in different styles including funk, folk, blues, bhangra and baroque. We are so proud of each and every one of our Reception Robin children this half term in their own unique learning journeys- they have been eager to learn, engaged and driven! **Robin Class - Year 1:** What a fun filled term we have had! A great end to the week celebrating Art Week. We have been mixing colours through printing, painting and drawing just like the artist Louis Wain, we have had so much fun being creators! Geography has ended this term and we have explored Captain Robert Scott and his trek to Antarctica which was over 100 years ago! We have enjoyed many stories for pleasure this week - we even shared our own short narratives based on our class read Look Up! **Kingfisher Class:** It has been great to be back together after London. The children have really enjoyed completing their own version of 'twisted tales' and furthering their understanding of division by sharing and grouping. Art Week has been a resounding success – there has been weaving, printing, painting and even sculpting. Kingfisher Class have worked so hard this half-term and I hope they all have a super rest!

**Partridge Class**: Art Week is always a popular week in Partridge Class! This time we have been focusing on art and design skills. We have looked at tinting colours with paint, sketching and crafting. We worked hard to produce puppets and a puppet theatre using a range of skills practised throughout the week- our final products looked fantastic! We also completed both our geography and science topics, ready for our new topics to begin after half term. On Wednesday, we took part in an inter school sports competition- we were all happy and healthy! Have a brilliant half term everyone!
