Around the Classes...

Robin Class-Reception: This week we have been continuing our journey into our space theme for this half term. The children have been very excited as another letter has landed from Ali the alien. They have been very busy working hard on writing their own letters back to Ali - we are very impressed! They have also worked hard learning lots of diagraphs this week in phonics and putting this into our writing in provision - amazing! In the outdoor provision they have been going 'to school' in our role play area, making some delicious space sand cakes and painting inspired by 'The Starry night' by Vincent Van Gogh! Another fabulous week!

Robin Class – Year 1: Another fantastic week in class. We have loved being independent and getting organised for our learning routine with positive attitudes towards tasks set. Monday started us off with the whole school Stargazing event, I heard it was a great success! And the artist Mr Layfield came to help us sketch a self portrait; ready for an exciting display to showcase. In English we have been exploring our new book 'Look Inside Space,' this is getting us ready to write our own space fact file. It has been great to see all children with their PE kit this week, ready for gymnastics and fundamental skills. A super week back and I am sure these positive attitudes will continue throughout the term.

Kingfisher Class: We have also really enjoyed using our Stargazing event to launch our English work – researching information about stars to write our own information texts. In Maths we have started to investigate Money – finding totals of coins and notes – any practise you could do at home with this would be fantastic! The children have a great time in Computing using the programme 'Scratch' to begin to investigate programming...and we even had a visit from 'Farmer Donaldson' who told us all about dairy farming as part of our Geography topic on 'Why does it matter where our food comes from?'

Partridge Class: It has been an unusual week in Partridge Class this week. I had a two-day course this week, and the teacher who covered the class was so impressed with everyone's attitude to learning, that she sent me an email to thank me to say how amazing all pupils were! Partridge class again impressed a group of visitors to the school on Thursday who came to observe a maths lesson. They were impressed by how engaged everyone was and their positive attitudes. I am very proud of Partridge class this week. A big well done for adapting so well and showing how amazing you all are!

Woodpecker Class: We kicked off the week with a visit from Chris who worked with the children on some 'doodle-style' portraits as we look ahead to our art gallery at Richmond Station. As ever, he was amazed, as was I, with their creativity and artistic ability! We have started our focus on fractions this week in Maths. Fractions isn't always everybody's favourite unit of Maths but I must say, the children have approached it brilliantly this week and we have made a great start which I'm sure will continue. We have also been using our imaginations in English this week, with our shared writing focusing on imaginative writing - I'm looking forward to seeing what they come up with in their own stories next week!
