Around the Classes...

Robin Class - Reception: This week we have been celebrating Chinese New Year - our Chinese restaurant has sparked so much language, turn taking, maths, writing and taking on roles of diners, waiters and cooks within play. Children have also been making lucky money wallets and Chinese lanterns, Chinese painting in mud, exploring sensory trays and adding special wishes for the Chinese New Year on our wishing tree. In PE we have been working on our balancing and running and stopping. We have been transferring our maths skills across provision - where we have been working on capacity this week - lots of mathematical language! The children's interest in puppets saw a new addition to our provision this week - an outdoor stage! The children have been enjoying 'putting on a show'. With 'Bird Watching Weekend' fast approaching this weekend we have been making bird feeders in school- we will be watching to see who visits us and if we can spot any patterns (working scientifically). So much learning - so much fun!

Robin Class - Year 1: We have had lots of fantastic learning this week! In maths, we have been delving deeper into place value and exploring numbers 11-20. We have even been writing number names. Mr Donaldson delivered us a new book called 'The Perfect Fit' and this has supported us with last week's shape theme. Our English work has involved a brand-new text called 'Look Up!' We are working towards writing our own short narratives. We have certainly been Lifelong Readers this week. The team captains held an assembly this week about the charity Shelter, and we have been talking about ways to help others and become Change Makers.

Kingfisher Class: It has been a wonderful week in Year 2 and has gone by in a flash! Inspired by twisted fairy tales, Year 2 have started to think about how we could twist the plots of some of our favourites to create our own narrative in English – we have had some really exciting ideas! In Maths we have begun to learn about multiplication – thinking about how pictures can represent multiplication sentences and what the x sign means. We will be continuing to think about this next week by exploring the 2,5- and 10-times table – any practise you can do at home would be wonderful! We are busy investigating 'Where does our food come from?' in geography, and this week thought about where cheese comes from!

Partridge Class: Another fantastic week for Partridge class! In our English work we have been working on using persuasive techniques. In maths we have been using concrete resources to divide 2 digits by 1-digit numbers. We are learning all about different types of clothing in our French work. There are lots of new words to remember! We also enjoyed a very informative session with the Interfaith centre, where we were able to ask lots of questions about Hinduism. The children were very polite and well mannered, which was noticed by the lady who conducted the session. Well done Partridges!

Woodpecker Class: Woodpeckers have continued to work incredibly hard, producing some brilliant work as always. We have continued working on fractions in maths and I was so impressed with their positive and conscientious attitudes we had to move the whole class onto the balloons on Thursday! In English, we have been exploring balanced arguments, focussing on deforestation to link in with our climate change topic in geography. The children went on to produce their own writing, choosing to argue against deforestation, and used their passion and enthusiasm to produce some great writing – living up to our change makers aim. A brilliant week before the fun and excitement of London next week!
