Around the Classes...

Robin Class: We are having a great time in Robins. We have been scientists this week and tried to make rockets. We failed but continued to persevere and we launched one yesterday! Further work to be done next week in this area. In computing Reception have enjoyed giving the Bee bots algorithms to make them move and Year ones have been inserting images into documents. We have found out who Henry VIII is in History and know some facts about him.

Kingfisher Class: What a wonderful week! The children have worked very hard in all areas of the curriculum. They have instantly become experts in finding arrays in maths and have even found them around school! In our English lessons they have written very persuasive information texts using expanded noun phrases and coordinating conjunctions. They also have worked very hard to develop their understanding of how to program software in their Computing lessons. Well done Kingfishers!

Partridge Class: In Maths, Partridge Class have reached the end of their unit of work on multiplication and division. All children have worked hard throughout and are now able to apply their knowledge to solve multiplication and division problems! In English we have finished writing our stories, based on our class text 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane'. All the children have used fantastic descriptive sentences in their writing and their final stories were fantastic! In our history topic, we have explored how crime and punishment changed during the 1500's and the introduction of witch craft and highway men!

Woodpecker Class: In English this week, we have been exploring balanced discussions. The example we used focussed on whether children should be allowed to eat chocolate for breakfast or not. There were arguments for both sides but the conclusion was that the negatives outweigh the benefits so if any of the children have said Mr. Cope says we can have chocolate for breakfast, please don't believe them (as I know that was their plan!). In maths, we have been converting decimals and fractions to help order them; this can be extremely tricky but I am really pleased with their attitudes. We have continued to learn about how 'Crime and Punishment' has changed in history and in science we investigated how the intensity of exercise can affect our heart rate (which involved a lot of heavy breathing).
