Around the Classes...

Robin Class: What a great first week back. The children were very enthusiastic to tell us all about what they got up to over the holiday. I really enjoyed hearing about the 'Party in the Park!' The children did some wonderful writing about their adventures. In Maths the children have been halving in Year 1, and adding on and taking away in Reception. Phonics and reading sessions are going well, with the Year 1's completing their Phonic Screening Check this week; all I can say is WOW!

Kingfisher Class: What a busy week we have had! This week, we have really enjoyed becoming David Attenborough in our reading and writing lessons. We have been researching giant pandas and reading lots of reports about different animals to help us plan our own reports which we will write next week. In maths, we have started to learn about measuring in non-standard and standard units – we enjoyed working in metres to measure our heights!

Partridge Class: It has been a lovely start to our last half term in Partridge class! We have been learning all about telling the time in maths and performing poems in English. In PE we have started our new topic for the term, athletics, and have practised our running, jumping and throwing skills.

Woodpecker Class:

We welcomed the children back after half term and we have had a great first week back. In maths, we have been investigating shapes and sorting them using their properties using some very tricky Venn diagrams which the children have picked up brilliantly. In English, we have moved from formal writing to more informal, picking out the features of a diary which will help us when we come to write our own next week. The children particularly enjoyed playing some AR games in computing which they then reviewed by producing their own vlogs and they have also approached our Joseph songs with brilliant enthusiasm!
