Relationships & Sex Education

Back in summer 2020, the Governing Body consulted parents regarding the Relationships & Sex Education Policy in our school. Some of you may remember this, however newer parents may not be aware of how we teach RSE, which (apart from some elements of sex education) is a statutory part of the National Curriculum. Around the Classes...

Robin Class: The children have been working extremely hard on their assessments this week. It has been wonderful to see the progression. An exciting end to the week with our History museum, showing off our knowledge about the famous explorers we have been learning about. The nativity practice is well underway. We cannot wait to share this with you all. You will be amazed. Kingfisher Class: It has been another super busy week in Kingfisher Class. The children have been working hard on not only the Christingle but also 'Baarmy Bethlehem'. Their performance skills are really improving and it is great to see their confidence growing. In our Maths work we have continued to focus on addition and subtraction and in English we have investigated poetry – reading a poem about Eid and then planning our own Christmas poems.

Partridge Class: We are really getting into the Christmas spirit in Partridge Class. We have been enjoying rehearsing for our Christingle service as well as reading some Christmas poems, ready to write our own next week. This week has been assessment week. I am so impressed with all of the class and how much progress they have made this term! We also finished our history topic this week and enjoyed sharing some of our learning with our adults in our history museum.

Woodpecker Class: The children have continued to work hard as we enter December and therefore the beginning of all of the fun festive activities that we have planned. In English, we have been learning the classic poem 'Twas the Night Before Christmas and we had a go at adapting it with some of our own rhyming couplets to great effect! In History, the children worked in groups to prepare activities for the History Museum which went down really well with all who attended so a big well done to them as it was all of their own ideas and designs. Finally, our Christingle rehearsals have begun and the children, as always, have impressed us with their enthusiasm and talent for performing!
