## Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week Robin class have been immersing themselves in all things linked to 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' - our class book of the week! They have enjoyed writing reviews about what they liked/star ratings for the book and if they'd recommend it! We have some fantastic lifelong readers! In maths we've been super impressed by their work on odd and even this week! We've been thinking about different seasons across the year and how these change- and go in a cycle! Just like our exciting new arrivals that have joined the Robin class, which has sparked so much conversation. We are watching and waiting to see changes over time from our new additions- caterpillars and incubated eggs! The classroom is buzzing with excitement!

Robin Class (Year 1): We have worked our socks off this week with the Phonic Screening Check! It has been a wonderful opportunity for the children to bring all their phonic knowledge together. I am extremely proud of each and every one of them, with their amazing attitudes towards learning! Our History topic 'Who used to live in Richmond Castle?' is well underway and we are excited to get out and visit the castle next week with our pre-planned questions! In Maths we have begun to explore fractions, we understand half and will look at quarters next week. In English we have been using exclamation and question marks in our skill writing.

**Kingfisher Class:** It has been another spectacular week in Year 2 with the children working their socks off! We have really enjoyed completing some creative writing based on different stimulus and had some super ideas. In Maths we have continued to investigate position and direction by increasing our understanding of turns and directions. We have enjoyed finding out more about 'Sappho' in History – investigating how we know Pompeii was part of the Roman empire. Even with the warm sunshine, Kingfisher Class have remained driven in everything they do!

Partridge Class: This week we have enjoyed delving further into our new history topic, this week focusing on why the Romans almost lost control of Britain. We also started our new science topic, sound, during which we learned all about vibrations! In English we are working on our sci-fi stories, and we have produced some outstanding work so far- all children are really enjoying this new style of writing! In maths we have moved onto learning all about shape, enjoying the warm weather whilst finding and describing shapes in the natural environment. For those who attend swimming lessons, another great session was had by all- it was a welcome relief to enjoy the cool pool water on such a warm day!

Woodpecker Class: The children have loved our writing focus this week, which has been based on a 'spooky' short, animated film. This enthusiasm has really shown as the writing they have produced has been fantastic. In maths, we have been working more practically, developing our protractor skills measuring angles and their accuracy, both in estimating and measuring, has really improved over the week. In History, we have explored reasons why Britain wanted to build an Empire around the world, discovering some of the reasons were more genuine than others! Finally, we have had a rehearsal for our end-of-year-production and, whilst we are in the early stages, the children are already amazing us with their talents but equally their dedication in learning their lines. A warm but brilliant week, well done all!
