Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week children have been experiencing their first taste of school transitions. We are so proud of the current reception children for taking their introduction to Year 1 in their stride. They had a fantastic time with Mrs Tunmore and we can see how ready, and eager they are to start their journey as Year 1's! In Maths this week we have been looking at digging deeper into solving problems where they have had to consider a range of questions to extend their thinking and reasoning skills. We have enjoyed our story of the week 'The Old Toy Room' and making a range of toys using junk modelling, using lots of different resources and techniques to create. We have also been enjoying exploring Lemon volcanos and frozen flower ice exploring cause and effect.

Robin Class (Year 1): What a lovely week in Robin Class, the rain hasn't dampened our spirits! We have been writing our own narrative based on the story 'The Three Little Pigs', we had some very different endings! In maths we have been consolidating our fraction knowledge, understanding halves, quarters, and equal parts. We have been liking the theme, 'Reflect, Revise and Replay' in music, where we have looked at rhythm and pulse and thoroughly enjoyed singing the song 'Hey You'! We also had an exciting visit to the Year 2 classroom with Mr Cope. The children showed us they are certainly ready for the transition ahead of them. Another busy week, well done Robins!

Kingfisher Class: Another fantastic week of learning in Kingfisher Class. We have enjoyed having a poetry focus to our reading lessons this week by reading 'The Slow Man' by Alan Ahlberg (one of our favourite poets!). We have also enjoyed completing mass problems in our Maths lessons and investigating GIS to compare Hunton and Kampong Ayer. Our geography knowledge and vocabulary has come on such a long way – I am so proud of Year 2. We have also worked hard on supporting Key Stage 2 with their 'Olivia' rehearsals and are very excited about the arrival of the stage! Well done, Year 2!

Partridge Class: We have been busy rehearsing for our end of year production this week. All children are working so hard, and we can't wait to share it will you all soon! As well as this, we have been working on shape in maths. We created some 3D shapes using marshmallows and cocktail sticks, then described the properties of each shape to a partner! In English we have planned our information text. We are using knowledge from our history lessons to write a report all about the Romans!

Woodpecker Class: The Woodpeckers have had a busy week with a lot of rehearsals for our end of year performance which are going brilliantly - the children never cease to amaze me with their talents for performing. We concluded our Geography unit by showcasing all we know about our local river in a creative 2-page spread whilst in maths we have continued our work on angles. Thursday saw the Summer Disco and the children had a brilliant time and behaved impeccably as always - they are such good role models to the younger children!
