Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): Wow - what a fantastic first week into school! The Reception children have settled amazingly well and completed their first week - we hope you are as proud of them as we are! They have been working really hard on our Golden Rules - 'Be safe, Be Kind, Be Driven'. We have been very busy exploring all the exciting areas of provision and getting to know teachers and each other!

Robin Class (Year 1): What a super start to the year Robin Class! They have all settled into the Year 1 classroom beautifully, following our school rules exceptionally well. They have been extremely busy, sharing our No Outsiders story, becoming geographers, and exploring our local area. They have ended the week being super designers!

Kingfisher Class: The Kingfishers have had a wonderful first week as Y2s - their attitude has been fantastic and I have been so impressed with them! On Tuesday we had a No Outsiders lesson exploring how families can take various forms and they children also produced some book reviews for our reading corner. On Wednesday, we completed various tasks using our mapwork skills, investigating compass points, map symbols and human/physical features. Finally, we ended the week with some DT work; the children worked really hard to produce some structures you may find in a play area and all did a great job. A great start and hopefully a sign of things to come for the rest of the year!

Partridge Class: We have had an excellent start to the term in Partridge class! On Wednesday, we became geographers for the day and put our mapping skills to the test. We have also loved our DT days, particularly seeing our final pieces develop from the design stage to the finished product. The children have created their very own mini version of our school.

Woodpecker Class: We have had a fantastic start to the term in Woodpeckers class! On Wednesday, we became geographers for the day and explored the Yorkshire Dales looking for human and physical features. We then created some amazing artwork which captured the Yorkshire dales from a bird's eye view. We have also loved our DT days and worked hard designing, making and evaluating our frame structures of village houses for Hunton villagers, to make them smile.
