Around the Classes...

Robin Class: The highlight of our week has most certainly been our trip to Saltburn-by-the-Sea! The children had so much fun paddling, building sandcastles, playing on the 2p slot machines and taking part in a beach clean. Their behaviour was fantastic throughout and it was such a pleasure to see them being inquisitive, change makers and happy & healthy! We have used all of this excitement back in provision to create our own beach huts and paint some of the shells we collected. We have also experimented with ‘floating and sinking’ whilst in maths, we have been focussing on the composition of the number five. Such a busy week, well done to all of our children!

Kingfisher Class: We have packed a lot into a four-day week! In maths, we have continued our fractions learning – this time looking at quarters as four equal parts...ask us how we can find quarters of shapes and objects! In English, we have continued to enjoy our class text ‘Grandad’s Camper’ and use adjectives to describe things we might find at the seaside. Our geography lessons have focussed on how the climate of Kampong Ayer is different to Hunton. We are also enjoying the ‘Rabbit and Bear’ books which are our story time texts this half-term. If you’re looking for book ideas for home, we absolutely love them!

Goldfinch Class: A short week, however, we have filled it to the brim! Our English text ‘The Zebras’ Great Escape’ has continued and we are beginning to write our own narratives. ‘Diamond Dash’ is coming along well and we have incorporated the multiplication check on a weekly basis and the children are enjoying having the chance to improve their personal best scores weekly. Our fitness and athletics PE lessons have been lovely in the sunshine whilst in RE, we have been looking at Hindu life ceremonies and journeys in life. In maths, we have finished our ‘time’ unit and we have introduced ‘fractions’.

Partridge Class: Partridges have enjoyed starting their new text in English this week, ‘The Lost Thing’. They have loved exploring the story through the text but also through an adapted short film. In geography, we created our own definition of a ‘peninsula’ and used our map skills to identify different ones across the world. We have also explored ‘dans ma ville’ in our French lessons.

Woodpecker Class: The Woodpeckers have had a great final week as we have finished our preparations for next week’s SATs. We have mostly been revising some of the key content covered throughout they year, which has included marking Mrs Kawai-Calderhead’s attempt at a SPAG paper – the children were delighted to pick out some mistakes and share tips with one another about how to correct them! We have continued our learning across the curriculum, enjoying our work in music and science, as well as some athletics on the village green. We hope the children have a calm and relaxing weekend before next week and we want to remind them once again of how proud we are of each of them for all of their hard work!
