Around the Classes...

Robin Class: Robins have begun exploring atlases, amps and globes this week. We are trying to locate the UK - we think it looks a little bit like a dragon shape! Can you find it on maps at home? Reception children have begun to learn their sounds and are starting to use them to read short words. In Year 1, we have been writing a woodland description inspired by Goldilocks and the Gruffalo.

Kingfisher Class: We have really been flexing our writing muscles this week. We have adapted and changed the story of, 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' and the results were fabulous. In Maths we have continued to investigate place value and get to grips with creative partitioning. A super time was had at Forest School on Tuesday with lots of 'stick pets' and Kingfisher Class been super role models for our younger children. I'm very proud of how hard everyone has worked over the last three weeks! Keep it up.

Partridge Class: We have had another excellent week in Partridge class. In our English, we have begun looking at our story 'Stone Age Boy'. We made some excellent predictions and have had great fun acting out parts of the story! In maths we have continued with our place value topic, we are becoming experts at partitioning numbers!

Woodpecker Class: This week, Woodpecker Class have produced some brilliant descriptive writing, experimenting with contrasting vocabulary to describe both beautiful and gloomy settings. In maths, we have continued to work on our place value skills with a particular focus on rounding. We have also enjoyed comparing life cycles in science and practicing a variety of different types of passes in netball. Mr Cope and Mrs Donnelly continue to be impressed with their hard work and attitude!
