Around the Classes...

Robin Class: The children have been very enthusiastic with their reading this week. They are keen to get a raffle ticket in the Friday draw in Celebration Assembly. If they read 5 times at home and get a signature they get a raffle ticket for the Friday draw. We had two winners last week! We have been learning about the Muslim faith and the religion Islam in RE and enjoyed learning some of their stories. Reception children have had a practical week in Maths and have been measuring, everything! Year one children have been subtracting larger number using a variety of methods. Super week Robins!

Kingfisher Class: Kingfisher Class have really enjoyed getting to grips with more money work this week. They have worked hard to find the difference and find change – using all of our number bonds knowledge from earlier in the year. In English we have started investigating a new text, 'The Varmints' and as well as exploring and furthering our love of language, we have started to think about how we could write information in the style of a leaflet for tourists! The children have continued their scientific enquiry skills in Science and there were definitely some future Wimbledon finalists in their tennis lesson!

Partridge Class: Partridge Class have continued working on multiplication and division in maths. In English we have moved on from non-chronological reports and are now focusing on story writing! We are using our class text 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane' to write an alternative chapter to the story. Partridge Class have worked hard in the absence of Miss Pole this week, who is very pleased to have received fantastic feedback from staff in school. Well done Partridge Class, you are all super stars!

Woodpecker Class: This week, Woodpecker class have enjoyed designing their own Camp Green Lake in order to help them create their own persuasive leaflets. They had lots of fantastic ideas and applied these brilliantly into their work. In maths, we have been multiplying and dividing numbers with decimals and they have picked up some of the new methods we have looked at really well. In P.E. we have continued to develop our tennis and gymnastics skills whilst in history we have learnt how propaganda can be used before exploring how this can be linked to our topic of 'Crime and Punishment'. I have been really impressed this week, particularly with the writing they have produced!
