Around the Classes...

Robin Class: It has been fantastic to get back into the routines of our learning this week. For the Year Ones, we are continuing our addition journey and Reception have focused on 'It's me, 1, 2, 3!' We are very intrigued with our new topic; Who lives in a castle like this?' Finally, for our music lesson we have started the first verse of our new song 'rhythm in the way we walk.'

Kingfisher Class: We have enjoyed coming back to school refreshed after the holiday. We have continued to investigate addition and subtraction in maths – using our knowledge of number bonds, 1 more and 1 less and 10 more and 10 less to help us calculate. In English, we have investigated stories and thought about how we can vary the sentences we write. In History this term we will be investigating 'Who is the greatest history maker?' and we started our learning by finding out all about Guy Fawkes!

Partridge Class: What a brilliant first week back! Partridge class are enjoying getting stuck into our new topics for this half term. In history we are studying Ancient Egypt. We started with a hunt around the classroom where there were lots of clues hidden about life in Ancient Egypt. In science, we are studying rocks and fossils. We started with sorting rocks depending on their appearance. We are all looking forward to learning more about our exciting new topics. In English we are working on a newspaper report, whilst in maths we are continuing work on addition and subtraction. Partridge class are very excited for our whole school trip to Bolton Castle on Monday! Have a great weekend.

Woodpecker Class: We welcomed back the children after half-term and kicked off with a 'Big Read' where it was lovely to see our older children reading with and supporting our younger children in school. We then had our 'No Outsiders' morning where we read a story called 'Where the Poppies No Grow'; the children had incredibly mature contributions about how people's feelings can change over time and about why it is important that we remember significant events from the past even years later. In maths, we have moved onto written methods for multiplication and I have been really impressed with their attitudes and how they have challenged themselves. We have also started a new class text called 'The Boy at the Back of the Class' which we will continue to enjoy and explore throughout this half-term.
