Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week we have been enjoying designing, making and wrapping gifts in the workshop ready for Christmas. We have also been taking on the role of the post officer - creating letters, cards, postcards. We have made scented cinnamon playdoh and explored creating our own hanging ice ornaments - watching and waiting to see what would happen over time. In Drawing Club we have been focusing on the story 'The Jolly Christmas Postman' - designing our own vehicles to get all the characters to a party! The children have been perfecting their singing for our Nativity songs and working really hard! We can't wait to show you all next week!

Robin Class (Year 1): It has been another super busy week in Robin Class. The nativity practice is well underway. We cannot wait to share this with you all. You will be amazed as their performance skills are really improving and it is great to see their confidence growing. In our maths work we have continued to focus on addition and looked again at finding a part. We have started counting in 2s and 10s, please continue to do this at home. We also found out about James Cook in our History lesson this week; we look forward to sharing some of our learning with you all in our history museum soon. And we have been discussing our computing SMART rules, 'Be SMART with a heart!'

Kingfisher Class: As we edge closer towards the end of term, Kingfishers have been busy with rehearsals ready for next week's Nativity which is sure to be as brilliant as always. In English, we have been exploring and writing our own winter acrostic poems and the children have come up with some incredibly creative ideas! In science, the children are coming to the end of their 'animals including humans' topic and have been focussing on habitats and food chains. They have definitely lived up to our aim of being 'inquisitive with a thirst for knowledge' throughout the unit! The children are still working remarkably well despite all of the Christmas excitement so well done to them all!

Partridge Class: In English this week we have been looking at a type of poem called a kenning. We have enjoyed reading a range of kennings and identifying the key features. We are really looking forward to writing our own kenning next week. In maths, we have started our new topic 'multiplication and division.' We have created arrays for different multiplication facts and wrote the associated facts for that array. In computing, we have had a great discussion around the question 'can you use too much technology?' The children were fantastic at debating this question and were able to talk about the positive and negatives of technology.

Woodpecker Class: This week Woodpeckers have been learning about Anne Frank and read some extracts from her diary in English and Reading. In Woodpeckers, we have a real enthusiasm for History and this was further explored in our lesson learning about what life was like in 1940 Britain. The children got creative and produced fantastic double page spreads on topics such as The Blitz, rationing, education, evacuation and the black out.
