Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week we had another fantastic transition into Year 1 with Mrs Tunmore. The children have all been amazing role models for the new reception children, modelling how to follow our golden rules - being kind, safe, and driven! Amazing work Robin Class! Our caterpillars have transformed into beautiful butterflies, we have been taking care of them and watching closely, observing, and ended the week letting them off to explore in the Nectar Cafe! We have also enjoyed digging for fossils, creating our own dinosaurs, and making our own dinosaur fossils! Our story of the week Dear Dinosaur has inspired us to write letters to Dinosaur Dora asking questions! We've also been using some wonderful descriptive vocabulary to describe the dinosaurs!

Robin Class (Year 1): What a lovely week in Robin Class. Another transition session into the Year 2 class with Mr Cope. The children have thoroughly enjoyed this experience. We have been consolidating our skills in English and working on adding prefixes, through matching games (quite competitive) and sentence writing. In Maths we have been learning positional language, describing turns and position. The children loved being active in this and using their 'Mini Me' to describe position. PE has seen us becoming prepared for our annual sports day, we have explored hopping, jumping and leaping for distance this week!

Kingfisher Class: Another week has flown by in a flash! It has been a week of developing our speaking and listening skills by practising 'Olivia' – we can't wait to show you the final product next week. We have also enjoyed investigating capacity in Mathematics and continuing our reports on the Giant Panda. Year 2 also enjoyed an afternoon of becoming Year 3 in preparation for September – Mrs Hollocks and I were very impressed with their hard work and attitude. They are definitely ready for Key Stage 2.

Partridge Class: What a busy week! We have been working so hard on our end of year production, which is looking fantastic! As well as this, Partridges enjoyed spending time with their new class teachers on Wednesday afternoon. A great time was had by all! We are also looking forward to our trip to Grinton Moor today, during which we learned more about our local area and took part in lots of exciting activities.
