Around the Classes...

Robin Class: 'I'll huff and I'll puff and I'll blow your house down!', can you guess which story which have been reading this week? The children have been making houses and acting out the story. Reception have been introduced to their new theme 'Terrific Toys'. They have been discussing and drawing their favourite toys and playing in the Toy Shop. They have been looking at doubles in Maths and had a great time at Forest School. Year 1's have started their new History topic 'Who used to live in Richmond Castle?' and came up with questions to ask at their visit to the Castle. They have been looking at churches and Mosques is RE and have been busy with their phonics ahead of their Phonic Screening Check next week. **Kingfisher Class:** It has been amazing to be all back together this week. In Maths we have begun to investigate a new area of mathematics – position and direction. This week we have thought carefully about using positional language and how we can describe objects using vocabulary. In English we have enjoyed completing our non-chronological reports about Kampong-Ayer. There has also been great excitement as we have enjoyed joining Key Stage 2 for some production rehearsals and even found time to squeeze in our first History lesson from our new topic 'Who was Sappho and where did she live?' We have lots of questions about Ancient Rome!

Partridge Class: What a brilliant first week back! We have been so busy with trips, 'No Outsiders', rehearsals and of course lots of learning! We started the week with our 'No Outsiders' lesson on Monday, which was all about being yourself! We shared some lovely, positive comments to make each other feel confident and happy! We continued with our maths work on statistics, which we began before half term. This week we focused on bar charts and tables, looking at how the data is represented and answering questions based on the data shown. In English we are trying a new style of writing this week, building our skills to work towards writing a sci-fi narrative. On Thursday we started our new history topic with a trip to Piercebridge Roman Fort. We explored the remains and had to find information to complete a quiz about what we saw. A great day was had by all!

Woodpecker Class: We welcomed the children back after half term and we have had a great first week back. In maths, we have been measuring angles using degrees which the children have picked up fantastically. In English, we have written a non-chronological report on endangered elephants, (since we are Change Makers and are soon to be adopting an elephant from the WWF). We used our skills of note taking to assist this piece of writing. The children particularly enjoyed starting athletics this term for PE, with a focus on pacing. And they have also began learning our Olivia songs and lines with enthusiasm!
