#### **Relationships & Sex Education**

Back in summer 2020, the Governing Body consulted parents regarding the Relationships & Sex Education Policy in our school. #### Around the Classes...

**Robin Class - Reception:** This week we started our week learning about British values- and what it means to be British! The children enjoyed making tea, cards for special people and thinking about what we do in school to meet these values. We have been very busy practicing for the wonderful Spring concert over the weeks and we are very proud of the children's performance on Wednesday! Well done Robin Class! The children enjoyed finishing the week off supporting Comic Relief in free dress and celebrating St Patrick's day! Exploring lots of activities in provision! Another busy week!

**Robin Class - Year 1:** I must start by saying how proud I was of all the children in our Spring Concert. The children worked extremely hard learning all the words of the Spring poem and proudly stood up and shared with everyone. Science week has been very exciting. We welcomed in a Doctor and a Vet to our assemblies, who shared lots of interesting knowledge with us. I think many of the children were excited to understand how science is used within many job roles. And we must not forget our British Values Day which started off the week, where we took part in activities to help us understand British Values and how they link to our school life.

**Kingfisher Class:** It has been another really busy week. It began with our British Values Day, and the children were so impressive with their depth of understanding. We have worked in the classroom completing our assessments in reading and maths – we will share the results of them at Parents Evening next week. We have continued to explore why animals were important during World War 1 in our History lessons – thinking about how children in England would know a war was taking place. We have really enjoyed our week being punctuated with science assemblies – the helicopter pilot, doctor and vet were huge hits with Year 2!

**Partridge Class**: This week Patridge Class have really enjoyed our assemblies celebrating British Science Week. We have had visits from a doctor, a vet and a helicopter pilot, and we have all been very inspired by their work! In Science this week we have been making our own switches to make a circuit work, thinking about which materials would be good conductors. We have also been working hard on our assessments in maths, spelling punctuation and grammar and reading. All of the children have impressed me with how hard they have worked. You are all superstars Partridge class! Well done for another great week!

**Woodpecker Class:** We kicked off the week by learning more about our 'British Values' and the children participated incredibly enthusiastically in each of the planned activities, especially when considering what they would do as Prime Minister! It has also been science week with some fascinating assemblies. We started with a Doctor on Monday, we had a Vet on Wednesday and finished with a Helicopter Engineer today; a huge thank you to each of our scientists as the children were fascinated by some of the ways Science can be used in the real world! As it has been assessment week also, the children have worked exceptionally hard in the classroom, all aspiring to do their very best and impressing me immensely by their attitudes. A well-deserved weekend after a very busy week - well done everyone!
