Around the Classes...

Robin Class - Reception: The children have been finding out lots about minibeasts this week, going on hunts, making minibeast restaurants and bug hotels to help provide homes for our wildlife - living up to our 'Change Makers' school cim! Our story of the week, 'Dear Teacher' has sparked some letter and postcard writing. This week in Maths we have been looking at 3D shapes, exploring similarities and differences between them, building models, painting using 3D shapes and sorting them into groups. It was lovely to see so many of you at our Appreciation Event on Thursday morning - a brilliant morning was had by all! Thank you for your support!

We finished the week off creating a Robin Class Fact File, becoming scientists by researching questions we wanted to answer to make our own book to share with others! Great work Robins!

Robin Class - Year 1: A wonderful start to the week having a little meeting with you all and sharing how proud I am of your children. They have all worked extremely hard and it was a wonderful opportunity to share this. We had a very exciting delivery this week... a reply letter from the T-Rex!! Can you believe it! The children were ecstatic; it was such a special moment. For our RE lesson this week the children learned all about the Eid-al-Fitr Muslim festival and celebrations. The children have been working hard in their PE lesson, working on skills with a ball.

Kingfisher Class: We have enjoyed becoming Historians this week and learning more about animals in World War One. Who knew that cats, elephants and horses were so useful?! In English we have worked hard to plan our recounts and in Maths we have continued to get to grips with fractions – thinking about recognising and identifying halves. We are very much looking forward to Art Week next week and showing off our talents as creators. We also hope that lots of you can join us for our Easter Labyrinth on Thursday. Partridge Class: This week in Partridge Class we have been enjoying Maths with Miss Moran, learning all about tenths and hundredths. In our writing we chose our favourite animal to research, to help with writing our non-chronological reports. The final reports were full of lots of fabulous facts and were very interesting to read! We finished our science topic, electricity, with an investigation to discover the best conductors and insulators. We have also been working hard preparing for our Easter Labyrinth performance, we can't wait to share it with you all next week!

Woodpecker Class: As we edge closer to the end of term, the children have continued to work exceptionally hard this week. In Maths, we have been exploring the properties of 2D and 3D shapes as well as investigating different types of angles whilst in English, we have been focussing on different techniques authors use to end stories effectively - avoiding Mr. Cope's pet hate of ending with 'It was all just a dream...' With next week's Easter Labyrinth quickly approaching, the children have been learning lines and developing actions for our part of the story; I'm sure they will be great as always and we look forwards to sharing it with you next week.
