Around the Classes...

Robin Class - Reception: This week our story of the week has been 'The Beach'. We have been learning lots of interesting facts in our nonfiction book which has led to further research, within other books and ipads to find out more information! In maths this week we have been 'adding more' - looking at 'First, Then, Now' using concrete resources. A favourite being using the animals! 'First there were 3 sheep, Then 2 more sheep came into the field..... Now there are....'. We have been really impressed with the children - why don't you ask them to show you at home! This week our indoor role play area has developed into a Fish and Chip Shop - we've been developing our turn-taking skills as waiters and customers, and using lots of language and communication. Following on from the children's interests we have had lots of messy play opportunities this week, allowing the children to explore different textures and be creative! The children have particularly enjoyed the foam!! We have been very busy creating safety posters to make sure everyone stays safe at the beach next week and writing lists for what we need to take with us in preparation for the exciting event!

Robin Class - Year 1: Another short week, however, we have filled it to the brim! We have completed 'The Jolly Postman' recounts, do ask us what 'The Jolly Postman' got up to on his daily travel. Lots of exploring has been going on in the provision, where we have been using the weighing scales to consolidate our knowledge on mass. Ready for our exciting trip to Saltburn next week, we have produced a fieldwork survey to take along with us. Lots to look forward too!

Kingfisher Class: We have had a very busy short week in Kingfisher Class. In our Maths lessons we have continued to investigate measures – finding out all about metres and centimetres and measuring units of time. We have also explored more about Kampong Ayer in Geography – comparing homes and the climate in Hunton and Kampong Ayer. Our geography vocabulary is really building and we can explain the meaning of words such as 'equator', 'Tropic of Capricorn' and 'coastal' without any hesitation! We have also enjoyed flexing our writing muscles by showing off all of the spelling, punctuation and grammar work we have learnt about so far this year.

Partridge Class: Although it has been another short week this week, it has been such a busy week! We have been joined by Year 5 each morning this week, as Year 6 undertook their SATs. We have been learning all about money in our maths work and working on newspaper reports in our writing. We continue to learn about light in science, this week focusing on how sunlight can cause damage to our eyes and what we can do to protect our eyes. This week we say goodbye to Miss Moran who has been with us for a number of weeks. Partridge Class have loved having Miss Moran with us and we all wish her the best of luck for her future studies.

Woodpecker Class: What a week we have had in Woodpecker Class. First of all, a huge well done to the Y6 children who have worked exceptionally hard, with brilliant attitudes, when completing their SATs this week. We are incredibly proud of them and they should be proud of themselves as they have all tried their hardest and that is all we can ask of them. Y5 have continued to work hard converting units of measure this week, focussing on units of time and progressing to reading timetables. In English, the children have enjoyed planning and writing their own suspense stories, applying some of the writing skills we have been learning over the past two weeks to great effect. Due to all of their hard work, we had a more relaxed afternoon to finish the week as a way of saying well done to everyone!
