Around the Classes...

Robin Class - Reception: Wow!! What a week we have had! Our highlight of course was our trip to Saltburn-by-the-sea! We had such a fabulous time! We enjoyed creating wonderful sandcastles, beach school, paddling in the sea, researching 'Why do we like to be beside the seaside? and being global citizens living up to our 'Change Makers' school aim by litter picking, to keep our oceans and beaches clean! We are so proud of all the children, who were amazingly behaved - being kind, safe, and driven. We ended the week writing postcards all about our trip to the seaside and celebrating 'World Bee Day'. We have also been noticing some of the seeds we have been planting are beginning to grow...

Robin Class - Year 1: We started the week off by enjoying a mocktail from our 'Juice Stall,' as part of our 'School Aims' to be 'Change Makers!' This was an excellent way to fundraise for Water Aid. Then, we had a trip out to Saltburn beach - it was an incredible day. We became 'Global Citizens' through litter picking at the beach, we continued with our geography fieldwork "Why do you like to be beside the seaside?" The adults we met in Saltburn loved answering our survey questions. And of course, we built so many sandcastles, dipped our toes in the sea and had a delicious ice-lolly to cool us down. We were worn out on the bus ride back to school! For English, our focus has been the poetry book, Commotion in the Ocean, we are building upon our poetry skills. Maths has seen us explore arrays this week, we have found this quite challenging to understand rows and columns so we will continue to develop our knowledge together. **Kingfisher Class:** We've had a very industrious week! Year 2 have been very busy completing some of their end of Key Stage 1 assessments and their attitude has wowed me all week. Aside from these, we have continued to investigate measures in our Maths lessons – finding out more about time and length. In English, we have investigated the features of non-chronological reports and developed our use of the possessive apostrophe. We have even found time to squeeze in Geography and learn more about the way

transport is used in Kampong Ayer and compared this to Hunton. Well done, Year 2! **Partridge Class:** This week we have been learning all about time in maths, learning to read both analogue and digital clocks! Although this is a tricky topic, we have all worked very hard to tell the time to the nearest minute. We have been writing newspaper reports all about the King's Coronation in English this week. We also enjoyed our swimming session on Monday, for those who attended, it was exciting to get back in the pool after 2 weeks off Our Geography work on the Magic Kingdom continues, this week learning about why the state of

Florida is a peninsula. Next week is art week- don't forget we would be very grateful if you could bring in any old newspapers/ magazines/ pieces of material you may have lying around!

Woodpecker Class: A rather more 'normal' week for us this week in Woodpecker Class! In maths, we have been consolidating skills using the four operations, focussing on problem solving in addition and subtraction and calculating with greater numbers in multiplication. The children finished their suspense stories - which they did a brilliant job of - and we have now moved onto exploring non-chronological reports in English. In Geography, we have continued our rivers studies, focussing on how rivers play such a vital role in the water cycle before taking a trip to our local river to conduct some fieldwork, including field sketches, making detailed observations and investigating how fast the river flows.
