Robin Class - Year 1: What a great final week! We have had a super time celebrating Art Week. Our artist was Mark Lewanski; your child may know some facts about him. Our focus has been Landscapes using different media which the children really enjoyed. Our final lesson was creating a beach collage, which linked very well with last week's trip to Saltburn beach.
