Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week our story of the week has been 'Simon Sock'. The children have been very busy making their own sock puppets, matching and sorting socks into pairs, and helping to retell the story. In Forest school they enjoyed painting leaves and making prints to see what patterns they could make. A highlight of the week has been making our own Wormeries and minibeast houses - following our interests in minibeasts. We will watch and see if we have any visitors! We introduced Drawing club this week with our focus book 'The Colour Monster' - which has been promoting lots of enthusiastic drawing and writing within the provision and our 'club'. We have been so impressed with how hard the children are working with their phonics- a fantastic, enthusiastic attitude to learning! Keep up the great work Robin Class!

Robin Class (Year 1): What a fantastic week of learning! We loved participating in the whole school 'Big Read' sharing texts within our house teams. In our maths lessons we have continued to put our place value knowledge to the test by counting and representing numbers. In English, we have begun our class text 'The Day the Crayons Quit' to find out more about a recount. We enjoyed answering our investigative question, 'Whereabouts in the United Kingdom do I live?' in geography and practising overarm and underarm throwing at a target in PE. A super week, Year 1!

Kingfisher Class: The Kingfishers thoroughly enjoyed their trip to Bedale on Wednesday, exploring many of the human and physical features around the town before asking some members of the public some questions about why they were visiting Bedale in order to support our learning about 'Why is Bedale Brilliant?' in Geography. As always, the children behaved brilliantly and were a credit to the school. In English, we have shifted our focus to setting descriptions, exploring how to use expanded noun phrases to help describe a setting whilst in maths we have continued to use concrete and pictorial methods to develop our understanding or place value and particularly, how to partition numbers in different ways. The children are becoming increasingly settled into our new routines and are really thriving as Year 2 children.

Partridge Class: We have had another action-packed week in Partridge class. We thoroughly enjoyed celebrating European Language Day and created some fantastic t-shirt designs. In maths, we have been rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and even 1000 and using our reasoning skills to solve problems involving rounding. During our English lessons, we have looked at what we need to include in our writing when writing a letter. The children continue to be 'Online Detectives' in computing and used a search engine to find out facts. In PE, we enjoyed learning how to do a chest pass in basketball. Woodpecker Class: We have had another fantastic week of learning! The Woodpeckers have been exploring rounding numbers to the nearest 10,000, 100,000 and 1,000,000 in maths and have explored the features of a newspaper article, using inverted commas and parenthesis in English. The children loved the big read on Tuesday morning and enjoyed sharing their favourite stories with the younger children within school.
