Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): We have had a wonderful first week back into Spring 2 and our 'Terrific Toys' topic! We've enjoyed our story of the week 'The Three Little Pigs' where this has inspired lots of creative building and constructions, role-play and reenacting of the story. We also enjoyed reading an alternative to the traditional tale, 'The Three Little Wolves and the Big Bad Pig' and creating our own versions of our stories to act out! Amazing work! We've also been testing out different materials to make houses for the three little pigs working out which materials would be the best to use using trial and error and cause and effect. Some great teamwork!

Robin Class (Year 1): It's wonderful to see all the children settling back into class, after what we hope was a restful half term! On Monday we started the week with our 'No Outsiders' text, 'Max the Champion', where we considered how everyone can join in sports. We then launched our new history topic, about Toys; I was incredibly impressed with their knowledge, which they loved to share. We began a new text in English – 'Dear Dinosaur' the children have really impressed me with their sentence skills. We have consolidated our maths topic place value within 20 and can now confidently use a number line.

Kingfisher Class: The Kingfishers have settled back really well after the half-term break and have had a great first week. We kicked the week off with our No Outsiders lesson, based on a story called 'Blown Away'. In English, we have focused on a text called 'The Mystery Forest' for our reading and writing and the children have produced some brilliant descriptive writing, using their imaginations very creatively! In Maths, we have started our multiplication unit, focusing on recognising and making equal and unequal groups to begin and the children have picked this up really well. In the afternoons, the children have been studying some of the artwork by Friedensreich Hundertwasser before having a go at replicating some of the work themselves.

Partridge Class: It has been an exciting week in Partridge Class as we joined our friends in Year 2 at the beginning of the week for some collaborative learning. We enjoyed completing our 'Art Week' journey by investigating still-life drawing. We've also worked on researching and investigating key artists and developing our speaking and listening work by sharing our learning with the rest of the class. We have enjoyed beginning our new History learning and were stunned to find that our Anglo Saxon village had been invaded by the Vikings in Year 2 on Thursday – they stole our precious ornaments and even took Miss Armstrong hostage! The Year 4 children thoroughly enjoyed the responsibilities of been the oldest children in school at the beginning of the week and were super role models for the younger children!

Woodpecker Class: What a memorable week in Woodpecker Class! The children have excelled as risk takers during their three days at Newby Wiske and have come back exhausted but full of wonderful memories! We are all so proud of all they have achieved with activities including The Giant Swing, abseiling, climbing, survivor challenges and a Silent Disco. Their behaviour and attitudes were wonderful throughout the week. Back in school, they have enjoyed beginning their Science learning on Friction and completing a belated 'No Outsiders Day' using the text 'My Princess Boy'. A great week all round!
