Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): Wow! What a final week of half term and our 'Zoom to the Moon' topic! This week our story of the week has been 'The Dinosaur That Pooped A Planet'! The children enjoyed a surprise visitor, Mr Cope, to introduce and read our story on Monday, what a treat! On Tuesday we had the most amazing day at the Life Centre- exploring and understanding science and the world around us! We were especially excited to find a whole area dedicated to Space and got chance to conduct science experiments in a laboratory in our workshop! We were very proud of how beautifully all the children behaved throughout! We hope you have a restful break, before returning for our new topic 'Terrific Toys'.

Robin Class (Year 1): We have been getting creative in our whole school Art Week - exploring pattern, shape, texture, and the artist Kandinsky. We have had so much fun being creators! We loved becoming 'scientists' during our visit to the Life Centre, we certainly were 'Inspired by Science.' Geography has ended this term and we have explored Captain Robert Scott and his trek to Antarctica which was over 100 years ago! We have enjoyed many stories for pleasure this week - we even shared our own short narratives based on our class read 'Look Up!' I am so proud of each one of the children for working so hard this half term in their own unique learning journeys- they have been eager to learn, engaged and driven!

Kingfisher Class: What a busy week to finish the half-term! We started off the week working on our non-chronological reports about dragons as well as finishing our Geography topic about where our food comes from. Then on Tuesday, we had an incredibly exciting visit to the Life Centre to enhance our 'We are Scientists' unit of work and the children were absolutely briliant. As well as having time to explore, we visited the planetarium for a show and had a Science Workshop which the children thoroughly enjoyed. Towards the end of the week, our focus has shifted to our 'Art Week' where we have been studying L.S. Lowry and developing some of our art skills. The children have had a fantastic week to finish off and deserve a well-earned break. Well done to all. Partridge Class: What an incredible week Partridge class have had! On Wednesday, we had a trip of a lifetime where we spent an exciting day in London. The children had a fantastic time exploring the National Gallery, finding some very famous pieces of artwork, such as 'Sunflowers' by Vincent Van Gogh. Then we headed down Whitehall to the Houses of Parliament where we had a guided tour and were able to sit and watch the MPs debate in the House of Commons. Afterwards, we took a quick stroll to 10 Downing Street where we even caught a glimpse of Larry the Cat. The children were impeccably behaved, we couldn't be prouder of them! Back in school, we have been very creative as it has been art week. The children have created optical illusions, willow pattern plates and sculpted sea animals from soap. In English, we wrote a set of instructions about 'How to catch the Big Bad Wolf.' The children have thought really carefully and included lots of the features needed for instruction writing. Woodpecker Class: This week Woodpecker Class have had a visit from weightlifting athlete, Sian Peters. Sian is the 2023 World W35 silver medallist for 59KG and gold medallist in Europe. We were so impressed with the way the children threw themselves into the CrossFit workout and tried the power lifting moves. It was a fantastic afternoon by all! The children have also been enjoying immersing themselves in art week. We have explored artist Ben Mosely, completed some Zentangles art pieces and designed and made our own hats.
