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#### Around the Classes...

**Robin Class (Reception):** This week we have enjoyed going on a journey to 'Where the Wild Things Are' in our key text of the week. We have been making dens and going on expeditions to faraway lands! In PE, we have been focusing on perfecting our jumping skills with accuracy. We even had a go at learning French skipping - amazing perseverance and determination! Watching the rest of the school in their performance 'The Jungle Book' was a real highlight this week! The children have done amazingly well, excelling in their phonics assessments. It has been lovely to watch their confidence grow and we are immensely proud of them!

**Robin Class (Year 1):** The children have had a wonderful week and are getting more and more ready for Year 2. We were extremely lucky to have a sneak peek of the fabulous production 'The Jungle Book' which the rest of the school performed this week – we were impressed with all their hard work! We have enjoyed furthering our understanding of position and direction in Maths by exploring left, right, forwards, backwards, above and below. We have reached the end of our science topic where we have been comparing common plants and trees. PE has seen us use our coordination and combine jumps! Have a wonderful weekend!

**Kingfisher Class:** This week has been dominated by rehearsals and performances and our Kingfishers did us proud! They played their part brilliantly and joined in whole-heartedly with all of the signing; well done to all involved. Back in class and the children have continued to work hard. In maths, we have moved onto our measuring units, measuring objects in various units such as centimetres and metres which has also given us the opportunity to do some 'Alfresco Learning' on the yard, applying what we had learned in the classroom. I can't quite believe the children are heading into their final week as Year 2s – it doesn't seem like two minutes since they started but they have all made such great progress and have worked so hard they should be very proud of themselves.

**Partridge Class:** What a fabulous performance of the Jungle Book on Wednesday. The children have worked incredibly hard and did an amazing job. I could not have been prouder of them. You are all stars! In maths, we have been learning all about symmetrical patterns and lines of symmetry. We had lots of fun creating our own symmetrical patterns using objects from the maths cupboard. On Thursday afternoon, we were joined by the Kingfishers where we composed and performed our own pieces of music. We used crochets, quavers and semi-quavers, thinking carefully about the structure of our piece. We then performed using the chime bars.

**Woodpecker Class:** This week has been all singing and dancing in Woodpeckers! The children enjoyed practising and performing the Jungle Book and did a super job of performing – we're so proud of them all! We also began rehearsals for the Leavers' Assembly and can't believe our Year 6 children only have one week left at Hunton and Arrathorne Primary School! In Maths, we have been creating 3D shapes and exploring different methods we can use to find their volume. The children are very excited for the final week of term; we can't believe it is here already!
