Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week we have immersed ourselves in our new topic 'Who lives in a castle like this?'. The children have been creating shields and swords, dark dungeons, castles and much more to enhance their role-play!

An unexpected object was found in the Nectar Cafe, which sparked lots of discussion...where did it come from? Who does it belong to? We decided to head out to look for clues and came to the conclusion, it must be a dragons! We then thought about how we could try to catch a dragon, we wrote some instructions and set about our plan. We wonder if it will work!

The children worked hard taking part in our whole school 'Sports Afternoon' on Wednesday, showcasing their happy and healthy attitudes! In maths we have been reviewing 1 more and 1 less and focusing on comparing 2 amounts, which has more/fewer/ the same. Robin Class (Year 1): We have worked our socks off this week! We started with the Phonic Screening Check! It has been phenomenal seeing the children showing off all their hard-earned phonic knowledge. What superstars they all are! And of course, we had a little celebration to end the week! We were 'happy and healthy' during our two sporting events this week; we had lots of 'fun' at the 'Fun Run' and supported each other during the whole school 'Sports Afternoon', sharing our athletics skills through aspiring and excelling. Our history topic 'Who used to live in Richmond Castle?' is well underway after our visit to the castle. We found out why Duke Conan was important. In Maths, we delved deep into arrays. I am exceptionally proud of each and every one of the Robins, with their outstanding attitudes towards learning.

Kingfisher Class: We have had an exciting week this week, particularly during Wednesday's 'Sports Afternoon'. We were so impressed by their competitive spirit and each and every one of them more than lived up to our motto of 'Care-Aspire-Excel'. In class, we have moved onto 'shape' in maths, investigating sides and vertices of 2D shapes before we move onto 3D shapes next week. In English, we have continued focussing our writing on Grandad's Camper and the children continue to produce some great work based on the story. We began our new unit in History of 'Who was Sappho and where did she live?' which will see us investigate the town of Pompeii and the effects of the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in the upcoming weeks (we even have some real Mount Vesuvius rock thanks to Mrs Godlee!). Another great week for the Kingfishers and a huge well done to all of them.

Partridge Class: What a brilliant week we have had! We kickstarted our week with our fabulous class assembly where we shared some of our learning from across the year. On Wednesday, we had lots of fun during sports day. It was lovely to see the children being 'happy and healthy' and cheering on their houses. We also had another fantastic opportunity to be 'happy and healthy' when we went to a dance workshop at Richmond station. In history, we began our new topic and found out who the Maya were and where they lived.

Woodpecker Class: Woodpecker Class have had a hard-working week. They have enjoyed looking at portraits of Elizabeth I and discovered why she appeared to look younger as she actually got older! We have worked hard in Maths, continuing to develop our understanding of decimals – including how to use decimals to total 1 whole. In English we have continued to investigate setting descriptions; we worked together to write a shared description of a haunted house. We're looking forward to flexing our writing muscles and creating our own next week. Woodpecker Class were fantastic role models for the rest of the school during our Sports Afternoon – we were proud of them all!
