Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week, we have begun our transitions into Year 1, spending some time in our Year 1 outdoor provision. We are very excited to develop this area further, with the children ready for September when they spread their wings full time into Year 1! Our non-fiction book of the week 'See Inside Castles' has been developing our knowledge and interest of castles further, what they were like in the past, who would live in them and some of their different features. Our caterpillars are now within their chrysalis stage and transferred into their net home...we are hoping that in the next week or so we may see some butterflies begin to emerge!

Robin Class (Year 1): What a lovely week in Robin Class, the sun has been shining and we produced and delivered our very first Robin Class Assembly. The children were all incredible, their confidence blossomed, and we were super risk-takers. We have loved being outdoors in the shady Year 1 garden exploring in the mud kitchen and sharing stories. In maths, we have been continuing our fraction knowledge, understanding halves, quarters, and equal parts. We have thoroughly enjoyed having a poetry focus by reading and performing 'Seaside' by Shirley Hughes. Our history knowledge and vocabulary has come on such a long way, we have been investigating why people visit Richmond today – I am so proud of Year 1.

Kingfisher Class: We have had another busy week in Kingfisher Class this week, working really hard inside the classroom and outside during rehearsals. In maths, we have continued to develop our knowledge of shape, looking how we can sort shapes into groups based on their properties, whilst in English we have been considering ideas as we prepare to write our own sequels to 'Grandad's Camper'. The children were incredibly engaged with our History lesson on Monday as we explored what happened with the eruption of Mount Vesuvius and the devastating impact it had on the nearby town of Pompeii; the children have decided they would love a class visit to go see it first-hand. In such a busy time of year, the children continue to work incredibly hard, despite the scorching weather this week, so a big well done to all.

Partridge Class: In maths this week, we have been learning all about angles and we have found out about acute, obtuse and right angles. During English, we have started writing our own adventure story about two young explorers discovering an ancient Maya city. The children have really impressed me with their creativity and I have enjoyed reading them. We have also found out about a brutal game the Maya people played called Pok-a-Tok. The children are continuing to work hard during rehearsals of the Jungle Book. We are excited to show you soon!

Woodpecker Class: We have had another industrious week in Woodpecker Class. In Maths, we have moved onto a new unit of learning – investigating negative numbers and solving problems. In English, we have focussed on developing our speaking and listening skills by practising for our class assembly next week – this has also helped consolidate lots of our Science learning on 'Evolution and Inheritance' as we investigate famous scientists including Rosalind Franklin, Mary Anning and Charles Darwin. We hope you can join us for our performance on Monday. Many of our Year 6's are spending some time at their secondary schools next week – we hope they enjoy the experience and it helps them feel prepared for their new start in September.
