Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): In our British Values Week, we have thought about how we in Reception follow these continuously week after week. We talked about how we are all different (but all equal), how our opinions matter (for example by our votes in story time), how we make independent choices at lunch and snack times and how we follow golden rules to be 'kind, safe and driven' in Hunton and Arrathorne School. In Drawing Club, we have enjoyed focusing on 'Superworm'. This has linked well into our maths focus on measurement, length in particular! We have also been making our own Superworm playdoh characters....thinking about longest/shortest and comparing. This week we have enjoyed writing postcards (keep an eye on your letterbox) from our time at the beach! This has been a great writing hook for the children and their independent writing - we hope you are as proud of them as we are! They have worked very hard this half term in developing their writing skills! Robin Class (Year 1): Last week was filled with awe and wonder with the chicks pipping and zipping, we watched them grow daily, taking great care, feeding them, and showing them love and attention. However, unfortunately, they had to leave us before they got too big! But we had another wonderful week though; we got to meet three new additions to school - the lambs! They have joined us in the Nectar Cafe and will stay with us for the next couple of weeks. Another wonderful opportunity for us to take good care of them and to learn and understand the natural world around us, hands-on! Our story of the week has been 'What's Hiding at the Seaside?' We have been learning lots of interesting facts in our non-fiction book, which has led to further research, using other books and I Pads to find out more information! Our Geography vocabulary is really building and we can explain the meaning of words such as 'pier', 'rockpool' and 'seaside' without any hesitation!

Kingfisher Class: The Kingfishers have spent some time with the Year 1 children this week as our classroom has been used for the Y6 SATs and Mrs. Tunmore has been really impressed with some of their poetry work in English. In preparation for British Values Day, each day has been dedicated to one of the separate values, which has given the children to opportunity to learn more about them through a range of activities. To add to the excitement, the lambs have spent the majority of the week watching through the Year 1 classroom door so they must have been impressed with what they saw! In Science, we continue to monitor the growth of our plants for our experiment whilst in Geography; we have been comparing modes of transport used here in North Yorkshire with Kampong Ayer. Back to a little bit or normality next week but the children have coped brilliantly throughout.

Partridge Class: We have had a fantastic week in Partridge class. The Year 5 children have been working alongside us on a morning this week and it has been a pleasure to have them in our class. We have celebrated the British Values this week and have created our own board game with our own rules. In English, we have looked at the poem 'The Sound Collector' by Roger McGough and then used this as an inspiration to write our own poem. In Geography, we finish our unit of work by looking at why the city of Arica is the driest inhabited place on earth - ask your children why it is the driest!

Woodpecker Class: What a week! Our Year 6 children have truly shone throughout the week as they have completed their end of Key Stage 2 assessments. Their driven attitudes and determination were impressive across each test and I know they all tried their best – we are incredibly proud of them all. The Year 5 children have worked hard with Mrs. Hollocks this week investigating more about the British Values and writing poetry. In PE the children's work on rock'n'roll in Dance is coming along nicely and we're looking forward to seeing the finished choreography next week! Have a great weekend.
