#### Around the Classes...

**Robin Class (Reception):** We started the week remembering the fallen soldiers and following a two minute silence at 11am. We also looked at why the Poppy is significant and created our own remembrance display. On Wednesday, we noticed something strange in our classroom and immediately had to investigate! We noticed a 'crime scene'! A broken chair, an empty bowl with some porridge remains and some blonde hair.....who could it be? We made some wanted posters to warn the rest of the school Goldilocks might be around the school! In Drawing club our story 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' has continued our interest in the Three Bears and our topic 'Astonishing Animals' where we have been immersed in the story. In Maths we have been looking at comparing and noticing equal amounts and again have used our Goldilocks and the Three Bears story as a hook to make learning exciting and meaningful.

Robin Class (Year 1): We started off with a Remembrance assembly to show respect to all the fallen soldiers. Maths has seen us deepen our addition knowledge through number sentences about 'Mr Grumpy!' We are enjoying the number bond chant! History has started investigating 'Who is the Greatest Explorer?' We began by finding out all about Ranulph Fiennes. The Boom Whackers made an appearance in music this week! And Nativity songs are emerging, proving very exciting. Kingfisher Class: This week, the Kingfishers have been writing leaflets all about Planet Earth, explaining some of the problems faced but also some of the solutions. This was based on our story 'Dear Earth' which the children have thoroughly enjoyed! Maths has seen us developing our column subtraction skills but also solving problems with our number skills. In History, we continued to explore the Ancient Egyptians, considering the role of archaeologists in helping us learn about the past and the children have definitely been 'inquisitive' about our new topic. Another great week, well done to all!

**Partridge Class:** Well done for another brilliant week Partridges! In Maths, we explored factors by drawing our own factor bugs with chalk on the yard, investigating how many factors of different numbers we could find. The children have also created their own merfolk creator book to develop characters for their final story! In History, we began our WWII unit and the children showed great enthusiasm as we investigated why Britain had to go to war in 1939. They have been extremely creative this week, as always!

**Woodpecker Class:** Another wonderful week in Year 6! This week we have begun our new learning in Maths and really got to grips with fractions – particularly simplifying fractions and converting between mixed numbers and improper fractions! Our work linked to our text, 'How to Save a Tiger' has resulted in us creating some brilliant persuasive phrases, whilst consolidating our understanding of suffixes. In PE we have been thrilled to develop our netball skills and we enjoyed finding our 'How do we know so much about Ancient Greece?' to launch our History learning.
