Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week, Reception have enjoyed all things Paddington Bear! We have been on adventures to Peru, had a 'Paddington Tea Party' with marmalade sandwiches and enjoyed a range of Paddington activities following the children's lead! We talked about how to stay safe in road safety week and we were very excited to find and explore some ice in our outdoor classroom! In Drawing Club, we have been creating Gruffalo caves and our own woodland creature creationswith some wonderful and inspiring drawing and word writing!! In Maths, we have been looking at part and whole of objects and ourselves!! (My leg is a part; the whole is my body).

Robin Class (Year 1): We loved starting the week with the Big Read, the children enjoyed sharing their love of reading with lots of adults. And of course, the chocolate break time! We have been writing our own stories in English, based on the book 'I Want My Hat Back'. Ask the children who stole the hat! It was great fun wearing boots on National Farming Day! In Maths, we have continued to develop our understanding of addition, using number bonds to ten to help us. History has seen us discover Amy Johnson, who flew the plane to Australia solo. The children, as always, were incredibly inquisitive. Please remember to keep reading at home as often as possible – we are enjoying handing out raffle tickets for 5 reads per week.

Kingfisher Class: We kicked off the week with our 'Big Read' and really enjoyed sharing some time with our grown ups who were able to join us! We also had an incredibly exciting Wednesday; we attended a virtual orchestra concert in the afternoon before the Christmas Fair after school and the children really enjoyed both. Back to the classroom and in Maths, we have started learning about money. We have been adding and comparing various amounts so any extra work at home using real-life money would be really beneficial! We have come to the end of our English topic based on the text 'Dear Earth' which has seen us publishing a leaflet about how we can protect our planet whilst in History we have been learning about the discovery of Tutankhamen. A great week, big well done to all!

Partridge Class: We all had a wonderful time at the Christmas Fair and enjoyed the beginning of the festivities despite the bitter weather. This week, the children have conducted research in Science about naturalists, David Attenborough and Jane Goodall. They also had the chance to become naturalists themselves, observing a barrier reef and red panda live camera. We have been writing mythical stories about our magical creatures in English, the children have done a fantastic job and have been extra creative! Well done for another brilliant week, Partridges!

Woodpecker Class: We have had a great week in Year 6. We were so proud of the way the children took the lead during our Christmas Fair on Wednesday, and showed our school community what a fantastic bunch of young people they are! In the classroom we have enjoyed furthering our fraction skills by learning how to add and subtract fractions. We have begun to write our own persuasive information report on endangered animals and delved deeper into the story of the Trojan Horse!
