Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week, we have been very busy practicing our Nativity - including getting into costume to try them on and really take on the role of our characters. We have continued our adventures with Paddington Bear in our Drawing club text 'Paddington and the Christmas Post'. We have started making Christmas cards and enjoyed exploring in our own role-play post office. Following our curiosity in ice, we have experimented with melting ice and what things help to make the ice melt the fastest. What a busy week!

Robin Class (Year 1): Another super week! We have been writing neatly and producing a wonderful piece of presentation writing in English, ending the text, 'I WANT MY HAT BACK'. In Maths, we have been busy continuing addition skills, we loved being outdoors jumping in hoops and adding together our scores! We have continued to enjoy finding out more about great explorers in History – Christopher Columbus. We are working hard with tricky words, please could we continue to have a tricky word challenge at home, to help us consolidate our tricky words. As always, we have cared, aspired and excelled across each of our curriculum subjects.

Kingfisher Class: Another great week for the Kingfisher Class! In Maths, we have continued our work with money, converting and comparing amounts as well as adding/subtracting with money. In English, we have continued our new story 'Water Protectors' which has included writing our own water-themed poems. In History, we continued our study of the Ancient Egyptians by learning more about the pyramids, we have learnt about food-chains in Science and we ended the week by leaning how to say goodbye in French! Au revoir!

Partridge Class: This week, Partridges have been amazing scientists and conducted their own dissection of a flower. They identified all the different parts and used their knowledge to explain their jobs. We have also started a new topic in Dance, the twist! In English, the children are exploring Shakespearian English through The Tempest, reading the playscript and watching it being performed at The Globe Theatre. What a lovely week it has been!

Woodpecker Class: Year 6 have had a busy week. In Maths, we have taken a break from our fractions learning to investigate measures in our Maths lessons – converting between metric and imperial measures. In English, we have launched a new series of lessons based on a new text, 'The Boy in the Tower'. We've enjoyed finding out more about the Trojan Horse and considered what evidence exists, whilst also creating discursive texts to decide whether it was a fact, legend or historical myth!
