Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week, we have enjoyed the book 'What's in the Witch's Kitchen?', making lots of interesting rhyming potions in the outdoor area and using them to spark creativity in writing and drawing. We have investigated the insides of a pumpkin, been on a bear hunt with Mrs. Donnelly and zoomed through the week with 'The Room on the Broom'. We have been re-enacting the story using actions and creating a story map. To celebrate 'Recycling Week' and our aim of being 'Change Makers', we have been re-using junk modelling to create new things such as spooky castles and musical instruments.

Robin Class (Year 1): We have had a highly productive week where we have most certainly lived up to our ethos of Care-Aspire-Excel, both in and out of the classroom. Handwriting has become 1% better and we have all excelled with our curly caterpillar letters. We've taken care of each other and the classroom, which saw us achieve the shiny scrubbing brush! And finally, we aspired to ask wonderfully imaginative questions during our English lessons all about hats! We loved wearing each of the different hats and recognising their various roles.

Kingfisher Class: This week, Kingfisher Class have been working hard on their column addition skills, moving from more pictorial and concrete methods to using a formal written method – they have shown great resilience and have done a great job! In English, we experimented with using noun phrases to create some poetry based on our text 'Dear Earth' and we also had a great time in our intra-sport competition on Thursday morning, representing our house teams and being 'happy and healthy'.

Partridge Class: In Partridges this week, we have started exploring our new English text 'The Mermaid of Zennor'. The children have been discussing how humans negatively impact the environment in Science and have done a brilliant job exploring how we can support the local environment. They also enjoyed their sports tournament, competing in their house teams. We also finished our Geography unit, learning all about National Parks and we have been so impressed with how inquisitive they have been!

Woodpecker Class: Another fabulous week in Year 6! We have continued our work on the four operations in Maths, working hard to perfect our understanding of division and solving division problems. We have enjoyed our new writing journey based on the text 'Can We Save The Tiger?' after publishing our biographies based on George Méilés. In RE, we have been working hard to understand how Mother Theresa helped others through her service and in PE we have enjoyed using our TAG Rugby skills to develop small-sided games. We have also completed our Geography learning for this half-term and are looking forward to Art Week next week!
