Next Week

As most of our Year 2, 3 and 4 children will be attending their exciting Stargazing Residential next week, some children will be spending Monday and Tuesday with different members of staff. Thanks, once again, to our team both in school and in Northumberland, for their flexibility which mean exciting opportunities like this can take place. Reception will be taught by Mrs. Dozéy as normal; Year 1 (and the remaining Year 2, 3 and 4's) will be taught by Mrs. Tunmore and Mr. Cope and Year 5 and 6 will work with Mr. Donaldson and Mrs. Donnelly.

Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week, we started the week with our 'No Outsiders' Day and our text '10 Little Pirates' where we focused on how gender doesn't define what, or who, we can play with. The children put on a wonderful performance in our Spring Concert, sharing their poem 'Flowers'. We are so proud of them! We have enjoyed beginning our new theme 'Terrific Toys' where some of the children have shared their special toys from home. Our key text 'The Three Little Pigs' has captured the children's interest this week- we conducted an experiment which inspired lots of discussion about 'which material would be the best to make a house for the pigs?'. A great first week to kick start Spring 2!

Robin Class (Year 1): It's wonderful to see all the children settling back after what we hope was a restful half-term! We started the week with our 'No Outsiders' text, 'Ten Little Pirates', where we considered gender equality. We have continued our text in English, 'Send for a Superhero' and we delved into the suffixes -ed and -ing. The Spring Concert was wonderful, the children showcasing their singing skills, even singing along to a song in French! Gymnastics was fantastic this week, we created a sequence using 'balance, travel, balance.'

Kingfisher Class: We have had a great first week back with lots of exciting things to celebrate. On Wednesday, the children were brilliant as we performed in our Spring Concert with lots of beautiful singing. We have started a new unit in History, exploring the Stone Age, with this week's lesson focussing on whether they were simply 'hunter gatherers'. We also had an exciting Science lesson; the children were challenged to create the slowest marble run and they had great fun as they explored different ways of adapting their course. A great first week back with lots of excited children ready for next week! Partridge Class: Welcome back! We have had a lovely week learning lots of new skills. The children became geologists in Science and categorised different forms of rock by exploring them with magnified glasses. In English, we have been crime journalists and began identifying features of a newspaper to help us write our own newspaper article, based off our key text. We started a new unit in History, all about York, and the children had some very interesting predictions about what a 'head pot' may have been used for!

Woodpecker Class: It has been a great first week back in Year 6 and thank you to those who were able to join us on Monday for the SATs information meeting. We have continued to investigate ratio in our Maths lessons, and after deconstructing aspects of Grimm's fairy-tales, have begun to look forward to planning our own. We have enjoyed starting our new History unit of learning all about Ancient Maya and our new PE focus on Orienteering. Year 6 have also made Mrs. Pearson feel very welcome during her first week.
