### Around the Classes...

**Robin Class:** What a wonderful festive week we have had performing our Nativity production 'A King is Born!' and I am sure you will agree they were brilliant! Within provision, we have been getting into different roles whilst playing in our workshop, making and wrapping toys for Santa to deliver. In Drawing Club, we have been doing the text 'The Gingerbread Man' focusing on writing speech from the character! The children have all tried really hard in their Phonics assessments. We have sent home sounds and words, which they are working on to help, embed at home too. Well done Robin Class - you really have excelled yourselves this week!

**Kingfisher Class:** We're so proud of everyone in Kingfisher Class for their performances in 'A King is Born' – what a bunch of stars! In the classroom, we have been continuing to explore subtraction – including the Year 2 children investigating column subtraction. We have enjoyed finding similarities and differences between childhood in the 1960s and childhood in 2025. We've also been very busy in Science thinking about the seasonal changes, which happen between autumn and winter. Great work everyone!

**Goldfinch Class:** Another super festive week! Our prayer for the Christingle is coming along lovely, and the songs are simply beautiful. Sedrick is ensuring we are following classroom expectations. We have continued to appreciate finding out more about important 'History Makers', this week learning about Margaret Thatcher. We are looking forward to becoming 'change makers' on Monday with our cake sale (any donations please bring Monday morning, also £1 for a treat for ourselves would be wonderful).

**Partridge Class:** We have had a brilliant week this week. The children have finished their final English book of the year, writing some lovely sequels for their final piece of work. In History, we learnt about Pok-a-Tok and created a poster to advertise a game set on the 31<sup>st</sup> January 600AD! We've also been working hard on our Christingle performance and can't wait to share it with you next week.

**Woodpecker Class:** Woodpeckers have continued to work hard this week. In Maths, we have been working on converting units of measurement including length, mass and capacity whilst in English we have developed our skills in punctuating speech using embedded reporting clauses.
