I visited school on Monday morning, which saw the start of Art Week, and I spent time in each of the classrooms with Mr Donaldson. There was a wonderful range of activities, which enabled the children to develop different skills in each of the classes. Our youngest children were enjoying painting to music, making marks to represent what they could hear. Other activities across the school included learning about different artists and their styles with Year 1 focussing on Pablo Picasso, Years 2 & 3 were making sculptures in the style of Henry Moore, replicating his style of work, Years 4 & 5 were focussing on Monet and looking closely at his many works focussing on Water Lillies and finally Year 6 were analysing David Hockney's work using the seven elements of art. #### Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): Wow, what an inspiring last week of Spring 1! The children have worked hard in creating short phrases, enjoyed creating a chocolate shop and lots of Valentines inspired activities. We have experimented with volcano eruptions, created love potions and made our own versions of the story, 'The Dinosaur that Pooped a Planet'. During Art Week, the children have enjoyed creating outdoor art, Kandinsky inspired heart paintings and painting to music. Robin Class (Year 1): We have been 'Creators' all week for Art Week – exploring primary and secondary colours through mix, pattern and texture. Our artist focus was Pablo Picasso; ask us where he was born! We have thoroughly enjoyed reading like artists, sharing our curriculum spine books. PE has seen us explore shapes in gymnastics, what fun we had! The Beebots made an appearance again this week in computing and we recited our SMART rules. I am so proud of all the children, working extremely hard during phonic assessments. The children have all excelled in their own unique learning journeys this term. Have a wonderful break.

**Kingfisher Class:** Kingfisher Class have thoroughly enjoyed Art Week, creating lots of wonderful work using clay! We started the week by investigating famous sculptor Henry Moore, critiquing some of his sculptures and having a go at creating some ourselves. We then developed our clay-skills, experimenting with a variety of tools (including our hands) to make pinch pots and clay houses. We have completed our division unit in Maths and we also finished our Geography work, exploring extreme environments such as Antarctica, considering why penguins need to 'fly' underwater as opposed to in the sky. **Partridge Class:** We have had a lovely time this week, enjoying art week! The children recreated their own water lily painting inspired by Claude Monet. Then, we explored tones and shades to create three-dimensional paintings and our very own still life composition! It has been a very busy and exciting half term so enjoy a well-deserved rest!

**Woodpecker Class:** Year 6 have enjoyed reminiscing about our fantastic time in London, whilst also moving forward with our learning. We have enjoyed concluding our geography topic – tying in everything we have learnt to discuss our own thoughts on climate change. We have enjoyed our art week, which has centred around artist studies – using famous art work to develop our paint and mixed media skills. Have a lovely half-term holiday.
