Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): We have had a great first week back after our Christmas break! We have started out new theme 'Zoom to the Moon' and the children are highly engaged already - ready and eager to learn all about Space! Our story of the week, 'Alien's Love Underpants' has sparked lots of role play including creating a trap for the aliens (in case they try to take our pant drawings we made in class). We noticed something rather particular in our outdoor classroom...and wonder if the aliens have visited our school. Watch this space!

Robin Class (Year 1): It has been wonderful to welcome back the children - the snow and ice have made it even more exciting. The children loved exploring with the Arctic animals in the ice from outdoors with lots of scientific vocabulary used. For 'No Outsiders Day', we read the text 'Elmer', discussing that it's ok to be different. This term, we will explore invasion games in P.E., focusing on balance, stability and landing safely. The children have been fully engaged and enjoyed sharing tales from the school break and I am sure positive attitudes will continue throughout the term!

Kingfisher Class: The Kingfisher Class have had a great first week back and have quickly settled back into their usual routines. We kicked the week off with our 'No Outsiders' lesson, using a story called 'The Odd Egg' to explore themes such as treating others with respect and appreciating differences. In Maths, we have continued our multiplication work whilst in England, we have continued our work based around our text 'Water Protectors'. The children were excited to start their new Science topic all about materials, which will see us investigate various properties throughout the unit. A great first week back, well done!

Partridge Class: What a wonderful week back at school! The children have returned refreshed and as always, enthusiastic about their learning. We have continued our study of The Tempest, writing our own script for a new scene. In Maths we have started learning long multiplication, the children have been amazing! We also had a very exciting Science lesson exploring Solid, Liquids and Gases by melting chocolate and watching it turn back into a solid.

Woodpecker Class: Year 6 have gotten off to a wonderful start! We enjoyed our 'No Outsiders' lesson on Tuesday, focussing on the story 'Julian and the Mermaid' where we explored the idea that love is for everyone. In Maths, we have started our new focus on decimals; whilst in English we have continued to explore the dystopian novel 'The Boy in the Tower'. We've also loved exploring the first few chapters of our new story time text 'Varjak Paw'. We're certainly lifelong readers in Year 6!
