### Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): This week, we have enjoyed our Drawing Club text 'Whatever Next', creating our own new planets for Baby Bear and Owl to explore. We have been learning about the first man who landed on the moon, Neil Armstrong, made our own astronauts and created space pictures of the planets using chalks and large-scale paper. In Maths, we have been ordering numbers using our Numberblocks characters and continuing our subitising skills. Each week, the children are becoming more inspired by our theme 'Zoom to the Moon' and feeding their learning and taught vocabulary into their play!

Robin Class (Year 1): Finally, the snow disappeared, and we got off to a super start, embracing the outdoors for some of our learning this week. Geography has seen us begin our new topic 'How does the weather affect our lives?' which suited well as we studied the weather daily and measured the temperature. We have been continuing our 'Sidney, Stella and the Moon' journey, learning all about features in books, and creating a glossary. We have worked hard to learn lots of new alternate graphemes in phonics and putting this into our writing - awesome! And we were all 'happy and healthy' and 'risk takers' during the multi-skills sport visit.

**Kingfisher Class:** In Maths this week, we have continued to develop our multiplication skills by making arrays and investigating formal written methods for multiplication whilst in English, we completed our final piece of writing based on 'Water Protectors', writing an informative piece about the River Swale and how we can help to protect it. In Geography, we started our new unit exploring extreme weather environments, focussing on Antarctica to begin whilst in Computing the children have been writing algorithms using Bee-bots. Another great week — well done to all of the children.

Partridge Class: This week, Partridges have worked extremely hard. In Maths, we have been practising our long multiplication; the children demonstrated brilliant resilience and determination! In English, the children have been practicing their Shakespearean writing by creating their own iambic pentameter. In Computing, we began our new topic of programming, the children enjoyed moving their turtle and creating different shapes through different instructions. Well done Partridges.

**Woodpecker Class:** Year 6 have continued to impress this week. In Maths, we have investigated decimals by calculating and it has been great to see their confidence develop. We also loved beginning our Geography topic which focusses on climate change and links closely with our 'change-makers' aim. In Science, we have enjoyed researching the planets in the solar system, whilst creating setting descriptions linked to our text 'The Boy in the Tower' in English.
