Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): At the beginning of the week, we were very excited to find our caterpillars had emerged from their cocoons and transformed into beautiful butterflies . We had an exciting visit from The Tooth Fairy who collected the dragon tooth we found and left us a letter. It suggested we write to our new class teachers to tell them things we like! The children were very driven and focused! On Wednesday, the children enjoyed transitioning to their new class as 'Kingfishers'. They thoroughly enjoyed their afternoon with their new class teachers and couldn't wait to tell us all about it the following day! We are so proud of them!

Robin Class (Year 1): What a lovely week in Robin Class, the sun has been shining, and we produced and delivered our very first Year 1 Class Assembly. The children were all incredible risk takers and creators; their confidence blossomed! Thank you for taking the time to come and see us. We consolidated our history topic through investigating why people visit Richmond today and we loved our visit to Richmond Castle, where we were inquisitive. Some of us managed two castle trips this week! We said a tearful goodbye to Miss Auger, who has helped us along the way with our learning journey. Transition has started to Year 2; I am so proud of all of the children, and I will miss them very much next term.

Kingfisher Class: We have certainly had an interesting week in Kingfisher Class this week! The children worked incredibly hard to complete their end of year assessments, showing off everything they have learned this year. We have spent some time rehearsing for 'Annie', which is very quickly coming around, and in class, we have continued to read and write about The Great Fire of London during English lessons. In history, we explored how the treatment of Boudica by the Romans almost cost them control of the country. The children enjoyed our transition afternoon on Wednesday, meeting their 'new' teacher and spending the afternoon in their new class as we continue to prepare for September. And finally, what a way to end the week with our 'Castles Day', with Middleham visiting their castle and Richmond & Bolton doing some castle-themed activities for the day. The children have been brilliant throughout so well done to all.

Partridge Class: We have had a brilliant week in Partridges this week. In maths, the children started their new topic of position and direction, finding co-ordinates and remembering that we go along the corridor and up the stairs! We were also journalists in English, imagining we are questioning Phillipe Petite after he tightrope walked between the Twin Towers. The children have been completing their final assessments of Year 4 and 5. They have all made fantastic progress and I am incredibly proud of them. We are getting prepared for the end of year and they all had a fabulous time in their new classes - Year 5 spending time with their new teachers and Year 4 experiencing a new class!
