### Around the Classes...

**Robin Class (Reception):** At the beginning of the week, a very exciting package arrived for Robin Class... we had to answer a range of riddles to predict what we thought might be inside the box. Your children will be able to tell you all about our exciting new additions in we look forward to watching them grow and transform! We have particularly enjoyed role play this week, building castles both inside and outside, creating swords, shields and magical wands and enjoying dressing up for banquets to start off our half term theme of 'Who lives in a castle like this?

**Robin Class (Year 1):** We have worked our socks off this week! The Phonic Screening Check took place and it has been phenomenal seeing the children showing off all their hard-earned phonic knowledge. What superstars they all are! And of course, they deserve a little celebration! Our History topic, 'Who used to live in Richmond Castle?' is well underway and we have been devising questions we would like to find answers to during our upcoming visit. Maths has seen us delve deep into fractions, exploring halves and quarters. I am exceptionally proud of each of the Robins, with their outstanding attitudes towards learning.

**Kingfisher Class:** We have started lots of new units across various subjects in Kingfisher Class this week. In Maths, we have started to investigate 2D shapes, using vocabulary such as vertical, horizontal, parallel and perpendicular lines. In English, we have started a new text about The Great Fire of London, which began with children exploring facts about current London landmarks such as Buckingham Palace and the Tower of London. We have also started learning about the Romans in History, considering why Emperor Claudius wanted to invade Britain in the first place! Well done to all for their attitudes and behaviour this week.

**Partridge Class:** What an exciting week! Many of Partridge Class had an absolutely brilliant time at Armed Forces Day on Wednesday. Meanwhile, at school, we enjoyed a Q&A with Baroness Floella Benjamin. It linked beautifully to our previous English topic, 'The Empire Windrush', and the children thoroughly enjoyed it; it was brilliant for them to have context behind their learning. In Maths, the children have been exploring percentages. In particular, we have been learning how to find percentages of an amount and understanding the link between fractions, decimals and percentages. They have worked extremely hard this week. Well done, Partridges!

**Woodpecker Class:** We've had a wonderful week in Year 6. The children have continued to demonstrate all they have learnt through school in English. They have created some wonderful narratives based on our 'story time' text from last term, 'The Final Year'. They have enjoyed immersing themselves in our new History topic – investigating the history of the British Empire. In PE, we have continued to develop our athletics and volleyball skills whilst in PSHE we have begun to think about healthy relationships.
