Around the Classes...

Robin Class (Reception): We started our week with our wonderful assembly! The children spoke and sang beautifully, being 'Risk takers', sharing a snippet of their learning over the last term with you. It has been really special for us to watch their confidence develop across the last year to put on such an amazing, memorable performance. Our Drawing Club story 'How to Catch a Dragon' sparked our curiosity and the children wrote instructions about how to catch a dragon and set up traps. We found a very interesting object in the Nectar cafe...we wonder if it was left by a passing Dragon. In Maths we have been looking at Number bonds to 10 and we have also been using non-fiction books to learn more about knights and castles. **Robin Class (Year 1):** Another week has flown by! In English, we have written pamphlets based on the book 'Dinosaurs and All That Rubbish'. We have moved onto a new unit of learning in Maths, investigating place value within 100 whilst in R.E. we have been encouraged to become creators by drawing special items to welcome new Christian or Muslim babies. Finally, we look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at our class assembly on Monday.

Kingfisher Class: We have continued our work on The Great Fire of London this week. In Reading, we read some extracts from Samuel Pepys' diary (child-friendly versions) and in English we have been writing some of our own diary entries, considering how diaries are a great way to learn more about historical events. In Maths, we have finished our unit on shape, position and direction, exploring half, quarter and three-quarter turns using the vocabulary 'clockwise' and 'anti-clockwise'. In Music, the children have been working hard in preparation for the drumming concert next week – hopefully we will see some of you there!

Partridge Class: Partridges have had a lovely week this week. On Monday, the children practiced their skills in volleyball, trying to keep a rally between pairs. They finished the lesson with a tournament; they have really built on their teamwork and showed great sportsmanship to one another! In English, we role played being investigative journalists, asking a range of questions as civilians about Philip Petite and his amazing tightrope across The Twin Towers! The children are working extremely hard in their Annie rehearsals and can't wait for you all to see it. Another fabulous week in Partridge Class. Woodpecker Class: Woodpecker Class have had a fantastic week. They have further immersed themselves in learning about the British Empire in History, by finding out why the British Empire began to decline. In Maths lessons they have continued to investigate 2D and 3D shapes – all of this alongside some fantastic 'Annie' rehearsals (which are looking and sounding fantastic) and preparing our Strawberry Fair enterprise project. Thank you to everyone who supported the children in trying to make a profit!
